From the Principal

We certainly have achieved a lot this year particularly this term. It is great to see students out and about enjoying events.

We have been active recruiting some wonderful staff throughout 2024 so far. Credit to Carly Flavel for developing the information regarding our new staff – this will continue as there are a few more to add. We hope this allows the community an insight to our staff at the school.

It is the time of year for our reports which will be electronic through email/connect. Please save these as copies will not be available after four weeks. Reading through this has been enlightening and we certainly have some work to do in regards to our grades.

Our NAPLAN and OLNA data has been pleasing particularly Year 9 NAPLAN, however it seems that grades are not matching this. It is important that as a school we reflect on this and how to have this improved. Students also need to reflect on their achievements and have conversations about the purpose of school and pathways available. I often have conversations with students and there is a clear indication that if their pathway is unknown then we want to make sure our students have options, as many as possible, when they leave school. To have these options and be in best position, their WA Certificate of Education should be a priority. We provide opportunities for students to achieve their WACE and some as we are resourced for this. We understand that some students find this challenging and we provide other programs to accommodate. With subject selections for 2025 Year 11 looming this space will be limited to options for students. We will still be resourcing our usual courses however our selection process will be based on the grades the Year 10 student has achieved. The Career Conversations workshop is highly recommended for parents and the students – this provides some insight into the pathways available and various options within industries.

Social media seems to play havoc and it seems that parents are also finding this to be quite an enigma. I have had many a call from parents asking for support in cyber safety for their child. I often refer to the online safety website: **Online safety | eSafety Commissioner**. It is not only what children are accessing, it is also about who is accessing our young people – there are no boundaries in this space really and it has slightly seeped in the school causing challenges for us. We all know too well with current media news of people using AI to manipulate images – let us keep young people safe and place boundaries on social media.

The recent assembly was a great send off for our 2024 Country Week students. We have 2 passionate media students who have made a video of country week coaches and students interviewing them about their aspirations for the week. As circumstances evolved a number of staff had to step in at the last minute to pick up Country Week duties in Perth – leaving their family at short notice. This demonstrates our staff's dedication for our students. Mr Heil's organisation of the event has been exemplary and we hope to visit the students in Perth with some students.

Our P&C has regrouped and we have a vibrant Jacinta Russell at the helm this year and there has been an increase in numbers for our P&C. It is appreciated that we have a supportive P&C over the last several years and look forward to the goals they are setting watch this space.



How Much Caffeine are Children Allowed?

Currently, Australia has not determined a safe level of caffeine consumption for children. At this stage it is NIL CAFFEINE FOR CHILDREN. Food Standards Australia New Zealand reports that at doses of 95mg of caffeine, children aged 5-12 experienced disrupted sleep and other effects such as:

- Difficulty concentrating
- Difficulty sleeping
- Insomnia
- Nervousness
- Headache
- Rapid heart rate
- Anxiety
- Dehydrating effect

Energy drinks not only have high amounts of caffeine but most are high in sugar. They also may contain additives such as guarana, taurine, ephedrine and ginseng which act as stimulants. The high amounts of kilojoules (energy) can increase the risk of weight gain.
